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Spotlight Story - Airbnb's Media Takeover



This is an endpage of one of Airbnb's 8,300+ TV ads that aired everywhere this past year. Note how it romanticizes a loud outdoor party and conveniently leaves out any neighboring houses. Think they care about neighbors or want to crack down on party houses?

Ever wonder why big national TV networks (not local affiliates) like ABC, CBS, FOX, etc never do investigative news pieces about the nuisances & tragedies happening at short-term rentals? There's plenty of material, like what happened here, and here, and here. According to our friends at the Texas Neighborhood Coalition, there have been over 430 reported shootings at Airbnbs in the past 4 years, and the number keeps rising. This just happened a few weeks ago. You'd think that might warrant something on 20/20, or 48 Hours or one of those true crime networks like Investigation Discovery or A&E. But no, you'd be hard pressed to find anything.

Here's a theory as to why that is – just in the past year (April 2023-24), a top industry media tracking tool uncovered that Airbnb spent over a half million dollars running over 8300 TV ads across broadcast & cable. Do you think Airbnb would keep giving these media networks their money if any negative (i.e. truthful)

stories came out about them? Highly unlikely, don't you think? A dying media industry isn't going to bite the hand that feeds it. And this is just traditional television – imagine the # of ads (like the one above you can watch here) that are running on YouTube, Hulu & other streaming services!

And if you think just the media suppression is bad, take a few minutes to read this blockbuster article about Airbnb's secretive "safety team" that jumps in to snuff out problems that would inevitably lead to bad press.

So, like we mention in our Plea to the City, city governments that approve short-term rentals are effectively siding with an eight billion dollar booking platform with massive media reach over their own voting constituents, hard-working homeowners who've scrimped and saved thousands to afford to live in their beloved home, one chosen specifically to be in a safe (or so they thought) family neighborhood, not a tourist district made up of transient strangers coming in and out all the time, bringing in who knows what – maybe even something like this. That's right - an Airbnb being used to traffic meth!

Anyone familiar with the popular series *Breaking Bad* might remember this scene where Walter White came up with the idea to use termite-tented houses as meth labs. Ask your City Council this - what's to prevent any enterprising criminal from using short-term rentals similarly? The answer - absolutely nothing!
